Because it's difficult to keep track of Berlin's gallery landscape, we asked creative strategist and art expert Fousieh Mobayen about her favorite addresses at Gallery Weekend.

Galleries in Berlin: these eight belong on your list of places to visit

The 19th Gallery Weekend in Berlin is just behind us - and it was a complete success. From April 28 to 30, 2023, art-interested residents of the capital visited the premises of the 55 participating galleries as well as countless additional exhibitions and events together with collectors, museum representatives and curators from Germany and abroad.

But not only the art scene romp around at the annual event, more and more protagonists: inside the fashion world are also attracted to it; this year <u>Gucci</u>, for example, was one of the main sponsors for the first time. Also the French <u>vintage</u> resale platform <u>Vestiaire Collective</u>was there and invited selected Berliners to an art walk through Charlottenburg (you can find impressions below). This was led by Fousieh Mobayen, who charmingly presented her highlight galleries and exhibitions in the district. Mobayen is Iranian, grew up in Wuppertal, studied German and art and has lived in Berlin for many years, where she works as a freelance creative strategist and brand consultant and has also been an independent curator since 2018. As such, she also designs her own exhibitions and projects with <u>artists</u>and galleries, currently the group exhibition "Total Recall 2 – Break The Charm" curated by her can be seen at Galerie Burster. The focus is usually on illuminating the human reception of reality, shaped by culture, society, science and digital technologies.

1) Number 1 Main Rd

Founded in 2021 by Tom Esam and Paul Ferens, Number 1 Main Road began as a curatorial project. In March 2022 they opened their Neukölln space and started their program by opening a new exhibition every six weeks - mainly they show young contemporary artists whose art is shaped by the post-internet present.
